Welcome – Scott Festin

Scott Festin, Vice Chair called the meeting to order at 5:05 pm and welcomed those in attendance.

Approve minutes from last meeting- Scott Festin

The minutes from the January 13, 2016 meeting were reviewed. Linda Tranter made a motion to approve the minutes, seconded by Brigette Comish.

Parking – Art Erickson

Mr. Erickson introduced Mr. Allred, hall monitor, who talked about the on-campus parking situation. Unpermitted vehicles have been an issue. Along with complaints about lack of open stalls. Due to JATC and work release, it's not as big an issue in the afternoon than in the morning. This year 987 permits were sold for 750 stalls. Since the 20112-13 school year there have been a total of 1469 unpaid citations. Mr. Erickson distributed a list of possible options to deal with the parking issues. The list Included limiting permit sales to one permit per household, no permit sales of student has unpaid fines from previous year, no permit sales to sophomores (bulk of unpermitted vehicle citations in the second semester), lottery sales of permits equal to the number of stalls, carpool lots, assigned stalls, and build a bigger lot. These measures would be an objective way to filter eligibility. When a citation issued, students receive a ticket on their car and the fee is posted to Skyward. Riverton City has approached the school about taking the 20 stalls on 2700 West. The school has asked them not to. The SCC is asked to pay attention to the parking discussion in the notes. This will help the Administration when dealing with angry parents to have vetted issues with the SCC. The question was asked if non-permitted students could park at the Church across the street. Cars in that lot are towed. It may be used for special event parking only.

Land Trust Budget Review- Carolyn Gough

Ms. Gough distributed the proposed 2016-17 School Trust Land Budget for the SCC to review. The format remains the same as last year. The budget seeks to address four specific questions. 1. What

knowledge and skills should every student acquire as a result of instruction? 2. How will we know when each student has learned the essential knowledge and skills? 3. How will we respond when some students don't learn? 4. How will we respond when some students have clearly achieved the intended outcomes? The most valuable asset to give to teachers is time. In the draft budget, parenthetical items are expense items. Ms. Gough discussed a few details of some items.

The need to encourage teachers to take time to observe effective teachers. Attendance at the Solution Tree Conference, when held locally is encouraged. Last year there were 18 teachers from RHS in attendance. After the conference a group discussion and debrief was held. Some of the best things that happened this year from this conference.

The school is developing collaboration spaces where student and department data can be reviewed and teachers can chart their own progress. These are secured location where boards don't need to be erased, thus white boards are in high demand.

Technology to help with remediation and advancement. This year the school spent \$50,000 on Read 180 and System 44. These packages help second language learners and others to learn to read. The Math XL program is helping students to move forward and those in need of remediation.

Credit recovery opportunities. An online packet model that doesn't require teacher oversight. Students could be charged \$35 to be involved, just as with a hard-copy packet.

Mobile labs could take a bulk of the budget, but a lack of IT infrastructure is the bottleneck. Mobile lab in each classroom that wants one would be the goal. Currently, there are assigned labs to each department. Mobile labs are more affordable than a standalone lab but each mobile lab cart costs \$12,000.

The estimate of 2016-17 budget is \$136,000.

Accreditation: we passed. Years of effort to get to that point. The accreditation team had compliments for the participants. One participant had shared the experience of her special-needs son. After the meeting parents talked to mother about her son. Reviewers saw in action the service orientation of the school.

Fundraising Report- Janilee Taylor

Choir has not submitted fund raising report for some time. Janilee Taylor will get with Mr. Ulmer to get reports to Mr. Hagen.
