



A letter to those who are working tirelessly to provide opportunities for their children.

Dear Parent,

For many Utah families the ability to provide access to college and a successful career for their children may seem distant and unattainable. Parents may wonder how they would ever be able to afford the rising cost of tuition, on top of the rising cost of living.

The folks at Salt Lake Community College (SLCC) have been keenly aware of these challenges, and it is for this reason that beginning 2018, SLCC is proud to announce the **Concurrent Enrollment Transition Tuition Waiver**.

This waiver, **valued at \$1000** is available to any high school student who is a U.S. Citizen and Utah Resident and completes 6 college credits (about two classes) with good grades (3.0 GPA) through the Concurrent Enrollment (CE) Program.

Concurrent enrollment is a program where high school students, after paying a one-time \$40 fee to become a SLCC student, can take college classes in their high school, or on a college campus for the extremely low cost of \$5/credit or about \$15 per class. That alone would save your family over \$1100 in tuition for just two classes. Better still, research has shown that kids who participate in CE are more likely to complete a college degree than those who do not, because they learn how to navigate the challenges they will face in college after high school.

As a parent who cares deeply about your child's future success, we wanted to let you know about this amazing opportunity and encourage you to talk to your high school or call the SLCC Concurrent Enrollment Office at 801-957-6344 to find out more.

Once your child meets the above criteria they simply have to apply by completing some SLCC and financial aid paperwork and continue to take and do well in at least 2 classes (6 credits) each semester at SLCC.

We thank you for all that you have done to make the necessary sacrifices for your children so that they can have these types of opportunities and we look forward to partnering with you to help your child succeed.
