

Code of Conduct- Student Orientation Agenda (classroom visits by administration)

1. Hand out **magnet calendars**
2. **Attendance** – See hand-out
3. **Parking Reminders-** Soph. not on campus, 1 permit per household, park in yellow stalls
4. **Dress code:** See policy AA419 – Emphasize the following:
 - a. Short-shorts/dresses/skirts, tanks, bare midriffs – not allowed
 - b. “mutilated” jeans – rips, tears, holes in thighs
 - c. leggings, jeggings that are skin tight – be sure to cover rear end
 - d. Hats, bandanas, hoodies – not allowed
 - e. No drug references.
 - f. T-shirts with sexual innuendos, plays on foul language, inappropriate images, “crude, vulgar, profane, violent, or sexually suggestive” including guns & ammo.
 - g. Dance dress code – Students who come to a school dance are subject to the district dress code. Please be aware that the school reserves the right to deny access to a dance for any students whose dresses, blouses, or outfits do not “cover the midriff, underwear, backs, and cleavage at all times.” “Skirts [and] dresses...must be at least mid-thigh length or longer when seated.” Please plan accordingly for upcoming dances.
5. **Drug/alcohol/over the counter meds:** See policy AS90: Emphasize the following:
 - a. Prohibited Medication Substances:
 - Prescription medications in excess of a recommended eight (8)-hour dosage. Must be prescribed to student and in original bottle.
 - Over-the-counter medications in excess of a recommended eight (8)-hour dosage.
6. **Weapons/facsimiles:** See policy AS67: Emphasize the following:
 - a. “Possessing (regardless of intent), using, selling or attempting to possess, use or sell any firearm, weapon, knife, explosive device, noxious or flammable material, firework, chemical weapon (i.e. mace, pepper spray), martial arts weapon or other instrument including those which eject a projectile or substance of any kind, **or any replica or facsimile of any of the above**, whether functional or nonfunctional, whether designed for use as a weapon or for some other use.”
7. **Cyberbullying:** See policy AS67: Emphasize the following:
 - a. “(4) cyber-bullying: sending insulting, threatening or harassing messages by phone or computer, or electronic messaging”
 - b. Be aware: anything you post is out there forever. Also be aware that sharing pictures of students (including yourself) that are nude or indecent is against the child porn law.
8. Report any violations of the above policies (AS90/AS67) to a teacher or administrator immediately.
9. **Check-in/Check-out:** Emphasize the point that check-ins/outs are a safety issue. In the event of an evacuation or another disaster, if we had to locate people quickly we need to know if you’re really at school or not. Always let the school know if you’re leaving or coming.
10. **Activity cards:**
 - a. Need your card to get the student discounts and to get into some sporting events
 - b. Need your card to get into school dances
 - c. Reminder: Enrollment, class fees, and participation fees need to be paid if you want to buy a ticket to a school dance.
